




Classification as assigning (use systems to assign classifications of things) – what information has this material been 'assigned', and what impact does this have on the societies in which it is associated?

Format Photographers Ltd, Picture Agency - - An agency, access to photographs, use of photographs, cost of photographs 'Feminist' 'International Womens Day' 'Pam Isherwood' - All female. Highlights sexism in society and industry in 70s/80s/90s/00s. Feminism - suggests its marginalised, not mainstream Number - Archive. Old. Past. Not now. Part of a larger system, category, one of others.

Number - Dehumanises the photographer, devalues the woman that took it, it is now identified by a number not a name. The archive becomes the prominent carrier rather than the person who took the image or the agency that was celebrating women.

Feminist Demos Archive - Demos written over tipex. What did it say before? Who is creating the language of classification? Archive suggests past and not a present issue - which it is.

Pam Isherwood - Name of photographer, positive impact in recognising women photographers of the time, and prompts questions of what is happening now.

Date - image taken. Places it in the past, in a certain climate, is that justifying image or making it 'safe' as it was in the past? Suggest this is no longer a problem?
